- This film recounts the history and attitudes of the opposing sides of the US war on Vietnam, using archival news footage as well as its own film and interviews. The term hearts and minds was used as a method to bring a subjugated population on your side.
 - It shows how attitudes of American racism and selfrighteous militarism helped create and prolong this
 bloody US assault on the Vietnamese. It also gives voice
 to the Vietnamese people themselves how the war has
 affected them, and their reasons why they fight the
 United States and other imperialist powers, while
 showing the basic humanity of the people that US

The film premiered at Cannes in 1974. Columbia Pictures refused to distribute it; the producers had to purchase back the rights and released it by other means. It was shown in Los Angeles for the one week it needed to be eligible for consideration in the Academy Awards. It won Best Documentary Feature for 1974; presenter Frank Sinatra denounced it.
